
PURPOSE: This is a Postal History (marcophily) exhibit of Machine Flag Cancels with die letters, limited to the geographic area of the Main Post Office in Chicago, Illinois by the manufacturer American Postal Machine Company, from 1895-1899, used for the purpose of cancelling mail.

IMPORTANCE: The American Postal Machine Company (APMC) was the largest supplier of cancelling machines in the 1890's to the United States Post Office Department. The first APMC machines were installed in Chicago in early December 1892, and flag cancels introduced in 1894. Government-authorized, machine Flag Cancels are a definite, important, and closed chapter in U.S. postal history.

SCOPE: Chicago used Flag Cancels the longest of all large cities; Main Office and Stations combined usage continued for 34 years, 1894 to 1928. Flag cancels with die letters were used from early 1895 at the Main Chicago Post Office through 1899. Twenty-seven flag cancellers were installed in the Main Post Office in 1895 and 1896 producing 60 letter varieties.
