## **Interesting facts:**

Lafayette became a Freemason, before leaving France, when he was 18.

The Continental Congress commissioned him a *Major-General* on July 31, 1777 when he was only 19.

George Washington was a father figure to the orphan Lafayette.

Washington loved him like the son he never had.

Lafayette named his only son *George Washington Lafayette*.

President Thomas Jefferson offered Lafayette to be Governor of the Louisiana Purchase in 1803.

On his 1824-1825 tour, Lafayette visited all 24 states & traveled over 6,000 miles.

Lafayette is buried in Paris, France under soil taken from Washington's grave at Mount Vernon.
